Election of ALC Council members 2023

The ALC Council members are elected each year from our membership. The Council exists to manage the activities of the Section, which can cover a very wide range of interests. What we can offer to you depends entirely on the skills and interests of Council members, so it's important that we have new people coming forward as they bring fresh ideas and talents.

We have three vacancies for 2023 and online elections are managed on our behalf by the Club. To stand for Council you just have to complete a nomination form - **a copy is attached with this e-News and the deadline for return by post is 12 noon 1st February 2023.**

Council members attend four meetings per year. Two of these are online (by Zoom) and two are in-person meetings that take place at an ALC Meet. Travel expenses are paid at 45p per mile for the in-person meetings. For 2023, the in-person Council meetings will be at Kingsbury (20th May) and at Wolverley (16th Sept).

Council members can increase their involvement by taking on a Voluntary Officer role, but that's not a requirement, and you certainly won't be pushed into it.

Some fun ideas this month for reusing or repurposing small items that might otherwise end up in landfill.



Here's a great idea for those of you who knit, sew or crochet.
